Rules:

For each competitive event, points will be awarded for first, second, and third place. Some events will be on a participatory basis and points will be given for each participant from your team. The points will be based on the percentage of your team present at this event (small teams will not be discredited for size as percentages will be used based on group sizes for all point breakdown). There will be tables at each of these events where each member must check in to receive points. Look for the Homecoming 2009 banner!

By filling out the Registration Form you will be registered!

You can register as a competitive team: Fraternity and Sorority Life, Residential Life, or Student Organization /Club. The overall first, second, and third place finishers from each category will be recognized as ASU's 2009 Homecoming Winners!

Note: Fraternity and Sorority Life: You may only have one chapter from IFC and Panhellenic on each team. NALFO, MGC and National Pan-Hellenic may create larger groups or participate as a council or with a chapter from IFC or Panhellenic. Each team is responsible for registering themselves for the Homecoming Competition in order to be considered for points and the grand prize.

You can register as a noncompetitive team or individually for different events: This means you can join in on some or all of the fun! Register a team for dodge ball, sign up to donate your hair to Locks of Love, there are so many fun filled activities that you will not want to miss.

In order for your team to be entered into the Parade, you must fill out the separate registration form. This means that you will NOT have to register your team for each event separately. ***In the event that your team is unable to compete, please email competitions@asu.edu to let the event staff know about this change 24 hours in advance.*** Failure to do so will result in a 100 point deduction from your overall score.

Penny Wars

Penny Wars points will be awarded to the first, second, and third place teams. PAB will provide each table with a water jug. Checks may be made payable to the Roswell Park Alliance Foundation if entered into Penny Wars. Not familiar with the game?

Organizations put their pennies in their own container, one point is received for every penny in the container. Organizations may put other coins and paper currency into the containers of OTHER organizations jugs. Each silver coin or bill reduces the number of points from that container by the amount of the coin. (e.g. a nickel reduces the points by five, a dime by ten, a dollar by 100, etc...) The total monetary amount of silver coins and paper currency is deducted from the total number of pennies for the day. This is where strategy counts. Have fun with it! Penny Wars will begin promptly at 11:00am and end immediately at 1:00pm. Please help us in our community service project for the Roswell Park Cancer Institute!

LOCK OF LOVE AND GOIN' BALD FOR BUCKS

LOCKS OF LOVE

Locks of Love is a public non-profit organization that provides hairpieces to financially disadvantaged children in the United States and Canada under age 18 suffering from long-term medical hair loss from any diagnosis. Most of the children helped by Locks of Love have lost their hair due to a medical condition called alopecia areata, which has no known cause or cure. The prostheses we provide help to restore their self-esteem and their confidence, enabling them to face the world and their peers. For Locks of Love, hair will need to be 10" or longer. Hair cannot be bleached, but can be dyed.

GOIN' BALD FOR BUCKS

Goin' Bald for Bucks is a non-profit organization that gives men and women the opportunity to shave off their heads in an effort to reach out to cancer patients who no longer have any more hair. This is a symbolic gesture to let cancer patients know that people around the world are there for them!

Homecoming Parade Participant Rules and Information

Before the Parade

1. Remember, the ASU Homecoming department of the Programming and Activities Board (ASU) reserves the right to withdraw any parade entry that is offensive, illegal, or otherwise not reflective of Arizona State University or ASU Homecoming at any time.
2. The maximum height of all entries is 14' and the maximum width is 15'.
3. Floats will be judged on their ability to fit the theme of A Devilish Homecoming, convey spirit and creativity, and encompass, over all, the soul of ASU. There will also be a separate award for sustainability measures in making your entry.
4. All applications must be submitted by October 23rd, 2009, at 5pm. No exceptions. If you do not have the link to the form of submission, please email matthew.brinkmoeller@asu.edu.

At the Parade!

1. Please keep a distance of no less than 15' and no more than 20' between entries.
2. Please keep pace. Student pacers will be wearing staff shirts. You are expected to keep pace with them and listen to them at all times.
3. Please represent your organization well. This means listening to and cooperating with staff at all times during this process. If you have any questions or concerns, please find a staff member wearing a Homecoming Staff t-shirt.
4. It is PROHIBITED to toss any sort of candy from the parade. Due to the Halloween nature of the event, there will be candy stations/ areas for trick-or-treaters.

What you'll need for your float:

A plan:

That's up to you! With a Homecoming / Halloween celebration we are encouraging you to show the theme through a float you can express your spirit! Feel free to include music as well!

Materials: With help from eHow Article

2- by 2-inch wood
Wire
Staple gun
Nails
Adjustable ruler

Double face tape
Carpet knife
Staples
Hinges
Scissors

Float Process:

- Step 1 Build or borrow a flat trailer before you begin your design so you know the size of the float. A trailer that is 8 feet long or smaller is best for maneuvering the parade route.
- Step 2 Use ASU's Devilish Homecoming theme to help you determine the message of your float.
- Step 3 Submit a number of designs, discuss the designs with your team and agree on the one you will use. Decide on props to complement the theme and your message. Please do not include anything that will leave the float (ie, please do not throw or give out candy, or for that matter, anything off your float, the Block Party will provide guests with candy, food, drinks, specialty items).
- Step 4 Seek the approval of your float design with the parade department by October 23rd!
- Step 5 Gather your float construction team and assign specific tasks. Make certain everybody understands the individual assignments.

Flatbed Trailer or Hay Wagon Float

- Step 1 Construct a frame for the float's skirt using the 2- by 2-inch wood, and allow a 16-inch clearance from the ground up to the bottom of the skirt frame on the trailer sides and rear.
- Step 2 Make a slanted skirt frame to cover the front of the trailer and leave room for the trailer to turn on the hitch. Attach the wood skirt to the trailer bed with hinges to fold up during the transporting process.
- Step 3 Choose floral sheeting and cut it to the correct size (see Resources). Staple it to the bottom of the skirt and the deck of the trailer.
- Step 4 Measure the trailer's perimeter to calculate the amount of fringe and festooning to use. Staple the decorative fringe to the bottom of the skirt, and use the petal festooning to cover the line where the floral sheeting and the fringe meet.
- Step 5 Finish building the parade float by securing the props to the top of the trailer with nails, staples, tape, glue, wire or other materials.
